



## General Information

All admissions are provisional and are subject to approval by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

- The courses of study and examinations are governed by the regulations of BFUHS and DCI.
- The Classes for the failed/detained students start immediately after the declaration of the results. Attendance in these Classes is compulsory. All failed/detained students are required to for class tests/ central tests as well as send up examinations to be eligible to appear in the next university examinations.
- Inter- Dental College migration is not permitted, except under extraordinary circumstances as per Regulation of Dental Council of India/BFUHS.
- Apart from notified tuition fee structure for different categories, additional charges such as Eligibility Fee, Registration Fee, Administrative Expenses, examination Fee etc. as required by the University from time to time shall be deposited by the students.
- The rules and regulations, including fees, may be revised as and when required and the revised rules and regulations /fee will be applicable irrespective of conditions mentioned in this prospectus
- Inter- Dental College migration is not permitted, except under extraordinary

## Discipline Conduct and Liability

The students shall have to stay in the campus with utmost discipline and their parents shall have to give a self attested undertaking to the Principal at the time of admission. It is expressly implied upon the students and their parents to ensure a good disciplinary and moral conduct failing which, the students may be rusticated from the institution or maybe asked to vacate hostel accommodation. Being a residential institute, students must attend their theory and practical classes daily and their absence from classrooms and /or hostel shall be noted and efforts will be made to send the information to their parents in case of serious lapses. The parents are required to meet the Principal and the faculty from time to time for updates regarding the academic performance and other activities of their children/wards.

## Disciplinary Rules and Regulation

### A. Ragging

As per the current orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Medical Council of India/ Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, the following should be noted by all candidates and their parents/ guardians.


Ragging in any form is strictly forbidden. Ragging is defined as "Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act having an effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including any rowdy or indisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which a student will not do in the ordinary course and which has

the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student".

In this connection an extract of relevant directions received from Dental Council of India are reproduced as under:-

1. Every student for the purpose of his/her admission to the institution shall furnish a character certificate from the institutions where from he/she has passed his qualifying examination, which would mention the status of his/her behavioural pattern specially in terms as to whether he/she displayed persistent violent or aggressive behaviour or any desire to harm others.
2. The admitting medical institution shall keep intense watch upon students who has a negative entry in this regard.
3. An annual self-undertaking signed by each student, whether fresher or senior and his/her parent(s) jointly stating that each of them have read the relevant instructions/regulations against ragging, as well as punishments and that if the Ward has been found guilty he/she shall be proceeded against, shall be procured.  
Such a self-undertaking shall be furnished in English as well as in vernacular (mother tongue of the parent) at the beginning of each academic year by every student
4. In order to ensure the 'ragging free environment' in the campus, each institution shall compulsorily mention in the Prospectus and other admission related documents and shall depict the earlier directions of the Apex court and/or of the Central or State Governments pertaining to ragging as applicable, so that candidates and their parents are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.
5. Each institution shall have an Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad, which shall comprise of other than senior teachers of the institution, representatives of Civil & Police administration and local media.
6. In case the victim of ragging his /her parent/guardian is not satisfied with the action taken by the Head of the Institution or by other institutional authorities, or where Head of the institution is of the opinion that the incident ought to be so reported, it shall be mandatory for the institution to file a First Information Report with the local police authorities.
7. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution as per judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SLP (Civil) NO. 24295/2004.
8. Ragging in any form constitutes a criminal offence. A students indulging is ragging can be:
  - (a) Expelled from the institution.
  - (b) Banned from the mess/ hostel.
  - (c) His/ her scholarship can be withdrawn.
  - (d) Debarred from examinations.
  - (e) Denied admission to any institution.
  - (f) Prosecuted for criminal action.
  - (g) Lodging of FIR with local police against those who RAG/ABET ragging.
  - (h) Deterrent fine imposed in addition to above.



# Students Welfare Committee |

Sir

I am directed to say that as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, it shall be the duty and responsibility of Management/Principal of the Dental Colleges to create a conducive atmosphere for imparting dental education to the UG/PG Dental students undergoing training in such colleges and take all necessary steps to prevent/prohibit/curb ragging of any type in their Dental Colleges to enable students to study the UG/PG Dental Course and its various parameters and concepts of dental education in a calm and peaceful atmosphere as the dental education requires grueling studies.

Further, the relevant extract of sub-regulations 9.1.8 under the heading Measures for prevention of ragging at the institutions level (before admissions) of the above regulations is reproduce hereunder for your ready reference :-


"9.1.8 At the commencement of the academic session, the Head of the Institution shall convene and address a meeting of various functionaries/agencies, like hostel Wardens, representatives of students, parents/guardians, faculty, district administration including police to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably."

In view of the above provisions of DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009 and the decision of the General Body of the Dental Council of India arrived in its meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> June 2015 at New Delhi, I am directed to request you to kindly request/call any one member of Dental Council of India from your State or neighboring States (if not available in your State) to conduct a Workshop / Seminar / Conference at your Dental College in the month of November 2017, in the beginning of BDS Course, for periodic training to the members of the Anti Ragging Cells/Committees/Squads of Dental Colleges and for awareness about ragging between all students, as decided during the meeting of Anti-Ragging Monitoring Committee held on 12.06.2014 under the Chairmanship of Dr. R.K. Raghvan, Former Director of CBI at UGC, New Delhi.

I am directed to invite your kind attention to DCI's circular No. DE-167(Anti Ragging Cell)-2017/11809 dated 12.10.2017 on the above mentioned subject whereby all the dental institutions in the country were requested to furnish the requisite information in the prescribed format as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009 as per annexure-II of section 12 of the Regulations by 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2017.

2. In this connection, it is stated that your Dental Institution has not yet furnished the requisite feedback as per the time schedule prescribed in the above DCI Regulations, therefore, I am again directed to request you to furnish the requisite information as asked in DCI circular dated 12.10.2017, within 7 days from the issue of this letter, failing which, the DCI shall have no option but to take action as per section 11.4 of the DCI Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental College, 2009. The relevant extract of section 11.4 is reproduced below for your information and ready reference:

#### 11.4 At the DCI level:-

*If an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India shall impose any one or any combination of the following penalties on it:*

11.4.1 *To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of the Dentists Act, 1948.*

11.4.2 *To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the Council deem fit.*

11.4.3 *To stop further admission in the institution till further orders.*

11.4.4 *To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.*

11.4.6 *To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.*

3. Further, I am directed to say that in case any dental institutions could not get the aforesaid DCI's Regulations and above DCI's circular No. DE-167(Anti Ragging Cell)-2017/11809 dated 12.10.2017 on curbing the menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, the same may be downloaded from the DCI's website i.e. www.dciindia.org.in and furnish the complete details as per annexure II of section 12 of the said Regulations immediately.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its order dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal 887 of 2009 in the matter of University of Kerala versus Council, Principals', Colleges, Kerala and Others, constituted a four members committee of mental health and public health professionals with the following terms of reference.

- To ascertain the reasons and circumstances under which senior students resort to ragging;
- To ascertain the psychological impact of ragging on students;
- To assess and quantify the impact of ragging and indiscipline on the standard of education in an institution and relate it to the existing procedures used by MCI, UGC and other regulatory bodies to assess the suitability of an institution for recognition;
- To recommend urgent and mandatory mental health measures to be implemented in, and practiced by school, colleges, and all educational and vocational institutions, so as to curb ragging.

The four members committee has since submitted its Report entitled "Psychosocial Study of Ragging in Selected Educational Institutions in India" to the UGC. The report has been uploaded on the UGC website and may be accessed through the link [http://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/7661310\\_Psychosocial-Study-of-Ragging.pdf](http://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/7661310_Psychosocial-Study-of-Ragging.pdf). The recommendations of the study are enclosed at Annexure-I.

The important recommendations which call for an urgent action on the part of the higher education institutions are as follows:

- (1) The higher education institutions should organize welcome and orientation programmes at the beginning of every academic session involving the students through which a clear message shall be sent regarding acceptable and unacceptable behaviours. This must include zero tolerance to ragging, sexual harassment and discrimination based on caste, religion, ethnicity etc.
- (2) Apart from installation of CCTV cameras, a proper surveillance mechanism consisting of a human system of wardens, mentors etc. shall be institutionalized, wherein they should be in regular touch with the students and promote their inclusion in activities such as games, sports and extra-curricular activities etc. in the hostels.
- (3) A clear Standard Operating Procedure shall be laid down for dealing with the cases of ragging. The students should be made aware of these rules as well as the procedure for filing a complaint, who to approach and their contact information and the procedure that will be followed by the HEI, with assurance of anonymity of complaint.

- (4) Psychosocial Support and counselling should be offered to victims as well as perpetrators so that the potential for cyclical abuse is neutralized. The engagement of counsellor's with the students could also be in the form of sensitization/training modules on power and inequalities, prejudice, discrimination, exclusion, harassment and violence, using creative methods such as drama, art, films, and other media.
- (5) The institutions must appreciate the huge diversities in the institution in terms of ethnicity, language, religion, sexuality etc. and effectively address the diversity related concerns by assessing and monitoring the social climate of institutions through regular surveys of students and staff.
- (6) The higher education institutions must provide an environment where the students learn the values of democratic, mutually respectful relationships, non-violent conflict resolution, autonomous and critical thinking, compassion and caring, respect for differences, fairness and so on. This can be done by holding programmes and activities that foster civic engagement and responsibility, critical reflection on social issues and deliberation on values.

You are requested to implement these recommendations and ensure a ragging free campus and create an institutional climate which is supportive and fair, with faculty who are attuned and interested in student development, that will become the foundation of a dynamic culture that is just, progressive and open to change towards an egalitarian society.

## Annexure - I

### Recommendations of the Committee on "Psychosocial Study of Ragging in Selected Educational Institutions in India"

One of the most striking findings of our study is the widespread acceptance of ragging in our educational institutions and indeed in our society. It is frequently described as a rite of passage, of preparing youth for a tough and competitive world, and of being masculine. The findings clearly indicate that ragging occurs in the context of power relationships, in a deeply hierarchical and unequal society and is reflective of these social processes. It also occurs as a result of a lack of appreciation of the diversities we need to celebrate in a country like ours— of ethnicity, language, religion etc. Our study of bullying in schools indicates a continuum commencing from families to schools and finding expression in ragging in colleges and higher educational institutions. Indeed the Quality Education Study 2010-11 echoes this, revealing children's bias against the girl child, the disabled, religious minorities, 'lower castes' and children from other states and speaking other languages<sup>51</sup>. What is therefore alarming is the finding that people do not perceive ragging as a problem and consequently, do not feel the need to address it. In the light of this pervasive approval of what is clearly detrimental to students and the educational system, and a phenomenon that extends to the larger social fabric, making recommendations to respond to this issue is a complex and a rather daunting task; it cannot be met with a 'magic bullet' approach. Thus, the surveillance/ CCTV law and order approach is not sufficient or sensitive to address the magnitude of the problem. Thus, the recommendations made in this report are unanimous, and based on a wide range of sources and reading, including the Raghavan Committee Report, our review of literature and the findings of this study. Broadly, there are two sets of recommendations: I) short-term recommendations that are more top-down in nature, at the level of institutional systems and administrations; II) long term recommendations that call for multi-pronged approaches, that move beyond the educational system to look at root causes of the problem within the larger society. These are process-based approaches that (re)examine transformation of education,

inclusive growth and development, gender relationships (including the construction of masculinity), social hierarchies and perceived inequities.

#### A. Short-Term Recommendations

##### I. Institutional Role in Fostering Inclusion, Belonging and Acceptance of New Students

Our study shows that where the institution takes the responsibility of organizing welcome and orientation programs, it fosters a sense of inclusion and belonging, reassuring new students of their social acceptance into the institution. The role of ragging as a rite of inclusion to foster belonging to the new institution and to forge new bonds must be replaced by other mechanisms that meet the same purpose, are systematic, public, and involve the whole institutional community and not just the students. In particular, teachers, in collaboration with an elected/representative body of students, may play an important part in helping new students settle down by dealing with their anxieties, and making them feel welcome. Other institutional agencies must also be involved at this stage itself. For instance, faculty in charge of Equal Opportunity Cells should also spell out what steps the institution plans to take to reach out to students who need academic and other kinds of support, for example through remedial English courses, academic support for the learning disabled etc. Counselors should be introduced at such sessions and clear instructions should be provided to students on who to contact in case of need for assistance. In fact, some of this information, including on key contact personnel, should be part of an orientation package that students should receive upon their admission to the institution.

The recommendation is therefore for institutions to organize such welcome and orientation programs involving the student as well as the rest of the institutional community. Secondly, these orientation programs must also set out clear messages of acceptable and unacceptable behaviours. This includes zero tolerance to ragging, sexual harassment and discrimination based on caste, religion, ethnicity, etc. It may be desirable for faculty to engage the student community in debate and reflection on these issues, drawing from some of the findings and recommendations of this report as well as the Saksham Report<sup>52</sup> on sexual harassment.

## 2. Maintenance of Support Systems

Surveillance systems are largely understood to mean CCTV cameras. However, surveillance systems cannot be limited to such impersonal policing. In fact, they are illegal as they intrude upon privacy. Data from other countries shows that they do not decrease the incidence of hazing and violence. While they may act as partial deterrents, i) they cannot be relied for complete coverage; ii) they also induce a sense of complacency in administrators and prevent what needs to be done i.e. building a sense of community. This sort of intervention does not address the root causes of ragging.

'Surveillance' therefore needs to comprise of a human system of guardianship—of wardens, mentors, including senior students to be in regular contact with newcomers and to include them in activities such as games/ sports and extra-curricular, in colleges and in their residential facilities (hostels), where ragging frequently occurs. In contrast to the dominance-submission relationship enforced through the intimidation and fear associated with ragging, newcomers can be exposed to another version of authority— one that is firm, yet fair and caring.

## 3. Institutional Response to Ragging: Implementation of UGC Protocol and Guidelines:

A disconcerting truth is that no matter what mechanisms one puts in place, instances of ragging will continue to surface now and then. Complete eradication can be the goal but as we have seen in the case of child sexual abuse, putting in CCTV cameras in schools will not prevent a motivated perpetrator from attempting to abuse. Thus, there is a need for institutions to follow a clear protocol of response in instances where ragging does occur. The UGC has a protocol for institutional response to incidents of ragging and can be found on its website. This has been conveyed to all institutions and the anti-ragging committee of the institutions should be familiar with it. Furthermore, institutions should have operationalized the protocol with clear procedures and designated staff/faculty to take action as per guidelines. Thus, students should be made aware of these rules as well as how to file a complaint, who to approach and their contact information, and the procedure that will follow, with assurance of anonymity of complainant.

Our study showed a reluctance to take action against perpetrators in incidents of ragging for fear of damage to the reputation of institutions. Consequently, the perpetrators themselves are reassured by the culture of impunity that pervades our social lives and feel that they can get away because they have the 'right' social and political contacts and/or because they rely on the institution's concern about its reputation. We feel, on the contrary, it is to the credit of the institution if incidents of ragging are reported and responded to; this indicates not only the anti-ragging position of the institution, and its commitment to maintain this stance, but it is also reassuring to the student community and indeed civil society of the safe and enabling nature of the institution. Further, it counters the cultures of impunity, denial and silence that problems such as ragging and abuse are shrouded in.

#### 4. Widening the Role of the Anti-ragging Cell of UGC

Currently, the primary focus of the anti-ragging cell in the UGC is to deal with the complaints of ragging. The cell should also actively function as a nodal body to disseminate various information/literature pertaining to harmful effects of ragging, ways to curb the practice and improve psychosocial climate in institutions, etc. through booklets, website and audio-visual material. The cell should also conduct seminars, workshops, essay-writing competitions, etc. and engage students, faculty and college management in its endeavor to eradicate ragging.

#### 5. Accountability

While the NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) takes into account the issue of institutional response to ragging, this is attended to by most institutions in a perfunctory and mechanical manner. In order to instill greater accountability, it is necessary for the NAAC to actually check whether the institutions are fulfilling the conditions required for accreditation. Therefore, in addition to the mandatory form, institutions need to be regularly and systematically visited or inspected by the NAAC to ensure adherence to accreditation guidelines.

#### 6 Psychosocial Support and Counseling

Psychosocial support and counseling should be offered to victims as well as perpetrators so that the potential for cyclical abuse is neutralized. While it is desirable to have counselors in every college, we recognize that there is a shortage of human resources and skills in this area. Therefore, we recommend that every college identifies a nodal agency offering counseling/training services and nominate one or two faculty volunteers to train at these agencies and, in collaboration with them, offer support to affected students. Also, the UGC should budget for the provision of counselors and should have a list of recognized nodal agencies which can be accessed for counseling services, till such time as these capacities are developed within institutions.

For victims, counseling would need to focus on issues of support, reassurance and safety on the one hand, and on identity, assertiveness and efficacy on the other; for some victims, the impact may be in the nature of trauma in which case, referral systems for more specialized care, must be made accessible. The counselor or mentor may facilitate this process. For perpetrators, counseling requires to focus on sensitization, empathy-building and perspective-taking issues.

Counselors must also extend their roles beyond individual interventions to larger contact and engagement with student communities who face a great many problems such as first-generation literates, rural-urban and inter-state migration. Many of them are unable to deal with the 'freedoms' they are dealing with for the first time, in impersonal institutional spaces. Above all, our young people are not socialized to deal with issues of gender and sexuality. Ragging is a college-related custom that reflects social power dynamics around seniority compounded by compulsions related to gender. Thus, the counselor's community engagement should be in collaboration with existing committees within the institution, such as the gender sensitization committee, to foster a culture of conversations towards an egalitarian ideology formation. This engagement could be in the form of sensitization/training modules on power inequalities, prejudice, discrimination, exclusion, harassment and violence, using creative methods such as drama, art, films and other media. Involving the new students early in this process will foster inclusion and a sense of belongingness in them.



## 7. Promotion of Diversity

It is important for all educators in our country to appreciate and celebrate the huge diversities of India, in terms of ethnicity, language, religion, sexuality etc. One platform to flag off this idea of diversity is, for example, for students to organize food festivals celebrating cuisines from different states and communities of India.

Sexual minorities face a great deal of discrimination, including sexual violence and ragging. For instance, our study shows that ragging is often the manifest expression of homo-phobia. This again calls for synergistic interventions by various college committees (anti-ragging, gender-sensitization and sexual harassment committees). There are also colleges that have Queer student groups, who can be drawn upon to create an inclusive atmosphere through their activities.

Another group that is frequently discriminated against is people with disabilities. Institutions need to be disability-sensitive in a proactive manner such as providing for toilets and other infrastructure that is disabled-friendly. What is not adequately appreciated is that all of us are potentially people with disabilities. Indeed, more people acquire disabilities than are born with it. It is important that issues of access should be addressed. All public places should be disabled-friendly, commencing with our schools.

As also discussed in the Saksham Report, students from rural and more 'traditional' backgrounds moving into larger city universities and colleges may need assistance to address experiences of discrimination as well as ideas about 'appropriate' behaviour for men and women because this creates confusion and alienation among students. Thus, the rural-urban cultural clashes manifested through dressing sense, language, accent, kind of schooling, economic background, etc. is often a critical factor in ragging. Institutional residential facilities or hostels are spaces where these issues need to be addressed. One way of doing so is to allot hostel seats through lottery so that they reflect diversity; students from different batches of the colleges, from varied geographic and socio-economic backgrounds interact and learn from each other, fostering a sense of respect and a spirit of acceptance and not merely tolerance. Institutions that encourage students to cluster, based on region/religion/community, with an apparent objective of ensuring safety and protection, are counter-productive to

fostering the spirit of diversity; in fact, such measures lead to exacerbating parochialism that feeds into ragging.

Lastly, in order to address diversity-related concerns, assessments and monitoring of the social climate of institutions through regular surveys of students and staff, especially when there are significant changes in the student community such as increase in student intake/method of admission/social composition of student population .etc., would help enhance diversity interventions.

## B. Long-Term Recommendations

### 1. Interventions at School Level: Inclusive Education

Enough evidence about the prevalence, range and severity of bullying practices has emerged from this limited exploratory study to suggest that there is need for a national study or series of studies on the phenomenon. Such studies need to take into consideration urban, peri-urban, semi-urban and rural schools; government schools (which vary from the better resourced Kendriya, Navodaya and Sainik Schools, to poorly resourced rural or municipal schools) and private schools (where again, there is a very wide range); residential and non-residential schools; and religious schools (e.g., Vedic Pathashalas, seminaries and Madrassas). Studies need to make strong recommendations on operationalizing two major concepts—inclusive education and life skills education.

Despite the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) and Right to Education (RTE) initiatives, there are indications of exclusion and intolerance within the school, triggered and maintained by school systems, by parental prejudices and the warped hierarchies of the larger community surrounding the school. We are convinced that this intolerance forms the roots of later discrimination in institutions of higher education. Thus, we recommend that issues on religious and caste-based bullying should receive adequate attention in subsequent studies, as should sexual bullying, and exertion of peer pressure to engage in smoking, drinking or the use of other psychotropic substances. The foundation of such initiatives should be fostering the spirit of egalitarianism.

While awaiting the conduct and results from such studies, training teachers in providing students with life skills education, including conflict resolution, and assertiveness skills will be very important. In addition, designing meaningful, non-academic, practical modules on rights-based issues from a children's perspective, will be important for teachers as well as students to begin to work against deep-seated patterns of social prejudice which are continuing to play themselves out in our schools. These should be designed to actively work against notions of using bullying to 'teach a lesson' or 'for fun'. Likewise, active strategies to teach the general student community not to condone bullying behaviours, so that bullies are not perceived as 'popular' or powerful will be necessary.

## 2. Peer Support

It is recommended that the student body be actively involved in planning and implementation of programs to foster belongingness and inclusion. Such interventions include student mentors, student guides and buddy systems. Further, life skills education needs to be continued into college addressing issues that perplex youth—such as sexuality and intimate relationships, contending with academic and peer pressure. However, life skills programs at this stage need to move from individual and personal to the public and social spheres addressing issues such as by-stander response to situations of violence and social injustice.

## 3. Institutional Cultures and Pedagogies

Institutional cultures and pedagogies play a formative role in the lives of students. They influence the ways in which students think and respond, not only in the immediate present but also in the distal future. This is a crucial concern since it lies at the core of value education, a goal that all educational institutions profess. Sadly, as the present study has shown, there is a large gap between the stated ideals of institutions and ground realities. Indeed, there is a widespread belief that ragging serves as a 'socialisation' device equipping youngsters to meet the demands and be successful in the 'real' world – becoming tough mentally and physically, even if that entails aggression and manipulation of the existing power dynamics. In this regard, ragging reflects a set of values actually prevalent, perhaps deeply embedded, in our society. Educational institutions must live up to their lofty ideals by providing an alternate reality where students learn the values of democratic, mutually respectful relationships, non-

violent conflict resolution, autonomous and critical thinking, compassion and caring, respect for differences, fairness and so on. Some examples of how this may be done are:

- i) Programs and activities that foster civic engagement and responsibility, critical reflection on social issues and deliberation on values;
- ii) Co-curricular activities such as sports, music, theatre, social service to enable a sense of aesthetic engagement, openness and affiliation;
- iii) Creation of opportunities for student engagement and voice in college decisions, including student membership on college boards/committees so as to foster ideas of responsible agency and citizenship;
- iv) Pedagogies that stimulate students to question and seek answers on their own so that sensitive reflection is the style of responding;
- v) An institutional climate that is supportive and fair, with faculty who are attuned and interested in student development, that will become the foundation of a dynamic culture that is just, progressive and open to change towards an egalitarian society.

## Discipline, Conduct And Liability

The students shall have to stay in the campus with utmost discipline and their parents shall have to give self attested undertaking to the Principal at the time of admission. It is expressly implied upon the student and their parents to ensure a good disciplinary and moral conduct, failing which, the students may be rusticated from the institution or maybe asked to vacate hostel accommodation. Being a resident institute, students must attend their theory and practical classes daily and their absence from classroom and /or hostel shall be noted and efforts will be made to send the information to their parents in case of serious lapses. The parents are required to meet the Principal and the faculty from time to time for updates regarding the academic performance and other activities of their children/wards.

## Disciplinary Rules And Regulation

### A. RAGGING

As per the current orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Medical Council of India/ Baba University of Health Sciences, the following should be noted by all candidates and their parents/guardians.

Ragging in any form is strictly forbidden. Ragging is defined as "Any disorderly conduct whether by spoken or written or by an act having an effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student, including any rowdy or undisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which a student will not do in the course of his/her course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment or adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student".

In this connection an extract of relevant directions received from Dental Council of India are reproduced under:-

1. Every student for the purpose of his/her admission to the institution shall furnish a character certificate from the institutions where from he/she has passed his qualifying examination, which would mention the status of his/her behavioural pattern specially in terms as to whether he/she displayed persistent aggressive behaviour or any desire to harm others.
2. The admitting medical institution shall keep intense watch upon students who has a negative character certificate.
3. An annual self-undertaking signed by each student, whether fresher or senior and his/ her parents, jointly stating that each of them have read the relevant instructions/regulations against ragging and that if the Ward has been found guilty he/she shall be proceeded against as per the provisions of the regulations.

4. Such a self-undertaking shall be furnished in English as well as in vernacular (mother tongue of parent) at the beginning of each academic year by every student
5. In order to ensure the 'ragging free environment' in the campus, each institution shall compulsorily mention in the Prospectus and other admission related documents and shall depict the earlier direction of the Apex court and/or of the Central or State Governments pertaining to ragging as applicable, so that candidates and their parents are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging
6. Each institution shall have an Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad, which shall comprise of other than senior teachers of the institution, representatives of Civil & Police administration and local media.
7. In case the victim of ragging his /her parent/guardian is not satisfied with the action taken by the Head of the Institution or by other institutional authorities, or where Head of the institution is of the opinion that the incident ought to be so reported, it shall be mandatory for the institution to file a First Information Report with the local police authorities.
8. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution as per judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SLP (Civil) NO. 24295/2004.
9. Ragging in any form constitutes a criminal offence. A student indulging in ragging can be:

- (a) Expelled from the institution.
- (b) Banned from the mess/ hostel.
- (c) His/ her scholarship can be withdrawn.
- (d) Debarred from examinations.
- (e) Denied admission to any institution.
- (f) Prosecuted for criminal action.
- (g) Lodging of FIR with local police against those who RAG/ABET ragging.
- (h) Deterrent fine imposed in addition to above.

If any incidence of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would proceed with action as outlined above.

The aggrieved students are free to report any incidence of ragging to any member of the ANTIRAGGING COMMITTEE by written communication, telephone or SMS. All efforts will be made to keep the name of the reporting person confidential. The names and telephone numbers of the members of the committees are as follows,



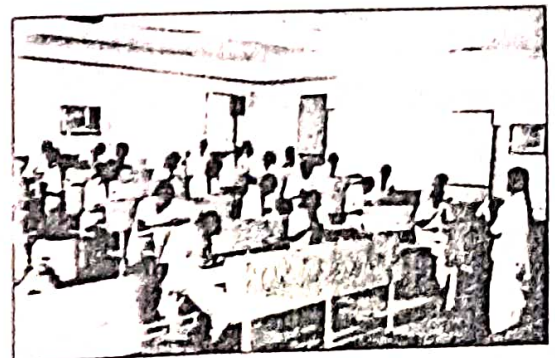
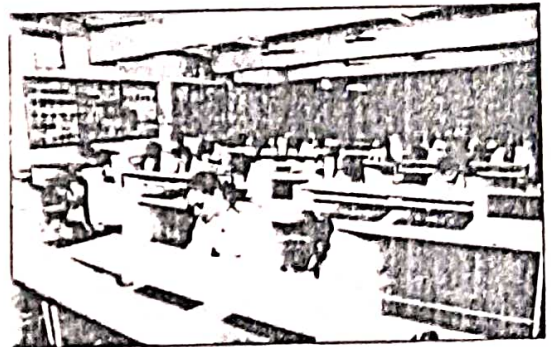

The relevant extract of section 11.4 is reproduced below for your information and ready reference:


**11.4 At the DCI level:-**

*If an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India shall impose any one or any combination of the following penalties on it:*

- 11.4.1 *To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of the Dentists Act, 1948.*
- 11.4.2 *To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the Council deem fit.*
- 11.4.3 *To stop further admission in the institution till further orders.*
- 11.4.4 *To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.*
- 11.4.6 *To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.*

3. Further, I am directed to say that in case any dental institutions could not get the aforesaid DCI's Regulations and above DCI's circular No. DE-167-2017/356 dated 07.04.2017 on curbing the menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, the same may be downloaded from the DCI's website i.e. www.dclindia.org.in and furnish the complete details as per annexure II of section 12 of the said Regulations immediately.

I am directed to say that as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, it is the responsibility of all the institution to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place in their dental institution and measures taken to curb it may be reviewed.

2. As per section 11.3 of the aforesaid regulations, the authorities/Management (Trust, Societies, etc.) of the institution, particularly the Head of the institution, shall be responsible to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place in the institution. In case any incident of ragging takes place, the Management/Head shall take prompt and appropriate action against the person(s) whose dereliction of duty lead to the incident. The authority designated to appoint the Head shall, in its turn, take prompt and appropriate action against the head.

3. It is also to inform you that if an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India, as per section 11.4 of Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, shall impose any one or any combination of the following penalties on it:

- 11.4.1 To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of the Dentists Act, 1948.
- 11.4.2 To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the Council deem fit.
- 11.4.3 To stop further admission in the institution till further orders.
- 11.4.4 To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.
- 11.4.6 To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.

4. Besides above, it is also mentioned that, as per section 12.2 of subject regulations, each and every institution shall submit its reports in prescribed format (Annexure-II) to the Secretary, Dental Council of India, Aiwan-E-Galib Marg, Kotla Road, New Delhi-110002, by 30<sup>th</sup> April of every year in respect of the previous academic session, indicating the requisite information against each column thereof, failing which action mentioned in Regulation 11.4 would be initiated against defaulting institution.

5. All dental institutions should issue advertisements against ragging through signboards, pamphlets etc. before the commencement of academic year as well as during the midst of the session. You are also requested to issue booklets to all the students of your Institutions containing the details about what constitutes ragging, punishable ingredients of ragging, punishments and penalty for ragging, names and mobile numbers of the members of the Anti Ragging Squad, Anti Ragging Committee (Anti Ragging Helpline), Wardens, Deputy Wardens of Men's and Women's hostel.

6. You are further requested to obtain and file undertaking, on anti ragging, from all parents/guardians and students (1<sup>st</sup> year to final year) studying in BDS/MDS/PG Diploma/Para Dental Courses of any other course approved/recognised by DCI, online through [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in) / [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org).

7. In view of the above, I am directed to request you that the requisite information in the prescribed format (Annexure-II, already available with your institution) for the previous academic session 2016-2017 may kindly be sent to us by 30.04.2017, positively, as the said information is required to be sent to the Monitoring Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. In case the information is not received by 30.04.2017, the name of defaulting institution will be forwarded to the said Monitoring Committee for such appropriate action as may be deemed fit and proper by the said Hon'ble Monitoring Committee.



All the expenses of the above workshop / seminar / conference including TA/DA of the member of the DCI shall be borne by concerned Dental College.

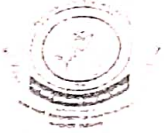



## Discipline Conduct And Liability

Students shall have to stay in the campus with utmost discipline and their parents shall have to give a self attested undertaking to the Principal at the time of admission. It is expressly implied upon the students and their parents to ensure a good disciplinary and moral conduct, failing which, the students may be rusticated from the institution or maybe asked to vacate hostel accommodation. Being a residential institute, students must attend their theory and practical classes daily and their absence from classrooms and/or hostel shall be noted and efforts will be made to send the information to their parents in case of serious lapses. The parents are required to meet the Principal and the faculty from time to time for updates regarding the academic performance and other activities of their children/wards.

## Disciplinary Rules And Regulation

### RAGGING

As per the current orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Medical Council of India/ Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, the following should be noted by all candidates and their parents/guardians.

Ragging in any form is strictly forbidden. Ragging is defined as "Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act having an effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including any rowdy or indisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof, in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which a student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student".

In this connection an extract of relevant directions received from Dental Council of India are reproduced as under:-

1. Every student for the purpose of his/her admission to the institution shall furnish a character certificate from the institutions where from he/she has passed his qualifying examination, which would mention the status of his/her behavioural pattern specially in terms as to whether he/she displayed persistent violent or aggressive behaviour or any desire to harm others.

2. The admitting medical institution shall keep intense watch upon students who has a negative entry in this regard.

3. An annual self-undertaking signed by each student, whether fresher or senior and his/her parent(s) jointly stating that each of them have read the relevant instructions/regulations against ragging, as well as punishments and that if the Ward has been found guilty he/she shall be proceeded against, shall be procured.

with a self-undertaking shall be furnished in English as well as in vernacular (mother tongue of the student) at the beginning of each academic year by every student

In order to ensure the 'ragging free environment' in the campus, each institution shall compulsorily mention in the Prospectus and other admission related documents and shall depict the earlier directions of the Apex court and/or of the Central or State Governments pertaining to ragging as applicable, so that candidates and their parents are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.

6. Each institution shall have an Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad, which shall comprise of other than senior teachers of the institution, representatives of Civil & Police administration and local media.

7. In case the victim of ragging his/her parent/guardian is not satisfied with the action taken by the Head of the Institution or by other institutional authorities, or where Head of the institution is of the opinion that the incident ought to be so reported, it shall be mandatory for the institution to file a First Information Report with the local police authorities.

8. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution as per judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SLP (Civil) NO. 24295/2004.

9. Ragging in any form constitutes a criminal offence. A student indulging in ragging can be:

- (a) Expelled from the institution.
- (b) Banned from the mess/hostel.
- (c) His/her scholarship can be withdrawn.
- (d) Debarred from examinations.
- (e) Denied admission to any institution.
- (f) Prosecuted for criminal action.
- (g) Lodging of FIR with local police against those who RAG/ABET ragging.
- (h) Deterrent fine imposed in addition to above.

If any incidence of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given the liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would proceed with action as outlined above.

The aggrieved students are free to report any incidence of ragging to any member of the ANTIRAGGING COMMITTEE by written communication, telephone or SMS. All efforts will be made to keep the name of the reporting person confidential. The names and telephone numbers of the members of these committees are as follows;

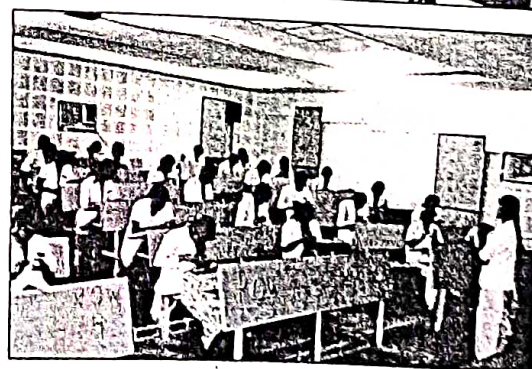

for the previous academic session 2016-17 to be furnished as per Section 12.1 of DCI  
Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009 - Regarding.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to say that as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental  
Colleges, 2009, it is the responsibility of all the institution to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place  
in their dental institution and measures taken to curb it may be reviewed.

2. In view of the above, it is requested that the necessary action in the matter as per the aforesaid  
DCI Regulations, 2009 be taken well before commencement of the Academic Session 2016-2017.

3. Besides, it is also mentioned that every Dental Colleges/Institutions is required to submit to DCI the  
information/feedback in the prescribed format (Annexure-II), indicating the measures taken by them for  
curbing the menace of ragging in their respective dental college/institution. The relevant extracts of  
Regulation No. 11.3, 11.4 & 12 are reproduced below for your kind perusal and ready reference.

### 11.3 At the Management level:-

The authorities/Management (Trust, Societies, etc.) of the institution, particularly the Head  
of the institution, shall be responsible to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place in  
the institution. In case any incident of ragging takes place, the Management/Head shall  
take prompt and appropriate action against the person(s) whose dereliction of duty lead to  
the incident. The authority designated to appoint the Head shall, in its turn, take prompt  
and appropriate action against the head.

### 11.4 At the DCI level:-

If an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India shall impose any one or  
any combination of the following penalties on it:

11.4.1 To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of  
the Dentists Act, 1948.

11.4.2 To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the  
Council deem fit.

11.4.3 To stop further admission in the institution till further orders.

11.4.4 To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.

11.4.6 To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned  
institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.

### 12. Submission of Reports to DCI:-

The each and every institution shall submit its reports in prescribed format (Annexure-II) to  
the Secretary, Dental Council of India, Aiwana-E-Galib Marg, Kotla Road, New Delhi-  
110002, as per the following time schedule:-

12.1 by 31<sup>st</sup> October of every year in which admissions are made, indicating the action  
taken by institution for implementation of Regulation 9.1 and 9.2 of these  
Regulations falling which action referred to in Regulation 11.4 would be initiated  
against defaulting institution; and

P.T.O....2/-

12.2 by 30<sup>th</sup> April of every year in respect of the previous academic session, in the prescribed format (Annexure-II), indicating the requisite information against each column thereof, failing which action mentioned in Regulation 11.4 would be initiated against defaulting institution.

4. All dental institutions should issue advertisements against ragging through signboards, pamphlets etc. before the commencement of academic year as well as during the midst of the session. You are also requested to issue booklets to all the students of your Institutions containing the details about what constitutes ragging, punishable ingredients of ragging, punishments and penalty for ragging, names and mobile numbers of the members of the Anti Ragging Squad, Anti Ragging Committee (Anti Ragging Helpline), Wardens, Deputy Wardens of Men's and Women's hostel.

5. You are further requested to obtain and file undertaking, on anti ragging, from all parents/guardians and students (1<sup>st</sup> year to final year) studying in BDS/MDS/PG Diploma/Para Dental Courses or any other course approved/recognised by DCI, online through [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in) / [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org).

6. In view of the above, I am directed to request you that the requisite information in the prescribed format (Annexure-II, already available with your institution) for the previous academic session 2016-2017 may kindly be sent to us by 31.10.2016, positively, as the said information is required to be sent to the Monitoring Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. In case the information is not received by 31.10.2016, the name of defaulting institution will be forwarded to the said Monitoring Committee for such appropriate action as may be deemed fit and proper by the said Hon'ble Monitoring Committee.

7. This may kindly be treated as 'Most Urgent'.

8. The Dental Council of India ensures Zero Tolerance against ragging of any sort.

You are advised to request the institutions under your ambit to step up anti-ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through various mediums; constitution of anti-ragging committee and anti ragging squad, setting up of Anti Ragging Cell, installing CCTV cameras at vital points, Anti- Ragging workshops, updating all websites with nodal officers complete details, alarm bells etc. Regular interaction and counseling with the students, identification of trouble-triggers, mention of Anti-ragging warning in the institution's prospectus and information booklets/brochures shall be ensured. Surprise inspection of hostels, students accommodation, canteens, rest cum recreational rooms, toilets, bus-stands and any other measure which would augur well in preventing/quelling ragging and any uncalled for behavior/incident shall be undertaken.

Amendment in UGC Regulations on 29<sup>th</sup> June, 2016 expanding the definition of ragging is as follows:-

Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at a student (fresh or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background".

This may also be brought to the notice of the institutions under your preview.

I am directed to say that as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, it shall be the duty and responsibility of Management/Principal of the Dental Colleges to create a conducive atmosphere for imparting dental education to the UG/PG Dental students undergoing training in such colleges and take all necessary steps to prevent/prohibit/curb ragging of any type in their Dental Colleges to enable students to study the UG/PG Dental Course and its various parameters and concepts of dental education in a calm and peaceful atmosphere as the dental education requires grueling studies.

Further, the relevant extract of sub-regulations 9.1.8 under the heading Measures for prevention of ragging at the institutions level (Before admissions) of the above regulations is reproduce hereunder for your ready reference :-

2. In this connection, it is stated that your Dental Institution has not yet furnished the requisite feedback as per the time schedule prescribed in the above DCI Regulations, therefore, I am again directed to request you to furnish the requisite information as asked in DCI circular dated 07.04.2016, within 7 days positively, failing which, the DCI shall have no option but to take action as per section 11.4 of the DCI Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental College, 2009. The relevant extract of section 11.4 is reproduced below for your information and ready reference:

11.4 At the DCI level:-

*If an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India shall impose any one or any combination of the following penalties on it:*

- 11.4.1 *To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of the Dentists Act, 1948.*
- 11.4.2 *To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the Council deem fit.*
- 11.4.3 *To stop further admission in the Institution till further orders.*
- 11.4.4 *To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.*
- 11.4.6 *To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.*

3. Further, I am directed to say that in case any dental institutions could not get the aforesaid DCI's Regulations and above DCI's circular No. DE-167-2015/123 dated 07.04.2016 and subsequent reminder dated 20.05.2016, on curbing the menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, the same may be downloaded from the DCI's website i.e. www.dciindia.org.in and furnish the complete details as per annexure II of section 12 of the said Regulations immediately.



8. In view of the above, I am directed to request you that the requisite information in the prescribed format (Annexure-II-, already available with your institution) for the previous academic session 2016-2017 may kindly be sent to us by 31.10.2017, positively, as the said information is required to be sent to the Monitoring Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. 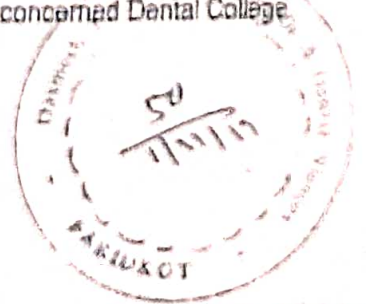

To, The Principals/Heads  
of all the Dental Colleges in the country.

Sub: **MEASURES FOR CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS – IMPLEMENTATION OF DIRECTIONS OF HON'BLE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA - information as per section 12.1 of DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009 to be furnished by 31.10.2017** – Regarding.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to say that as per DCI Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, it is the responsibility of all the institution to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place in their dental institution and measures taken to curb it may be reviewed.

2. As per section 11.3 of the aforesaid regulations, the authorities/Management (Trust, Societies, etc.) of the institution, particularly the Head of the institution, shall be responsible to ensure that no incident of ragging takes place in the institution. In case any incident of ragging takes place, the Management/Head shall take prompt and appropriate action against the person(s) whose dereliction of duty lead to the incident. The authority designated to appoint the Head shall, in its turn, take prompt and appropriate action against the head.

3. It is also to inform you that if an institution fails to curb ragging, the Dental Council of India, as per section 11.4 of Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Dental Colleges, 2009, shall impose any one or any combination of the following penalties on it:

- 11.4.1 To initiate the derecognition process against the institution under section 16A of the Dentists Act, 1948.
- 11.4.2 To reduce the admission capacity of the institution to the extent to which the Council deem fit.
- 11.4.3 To stop further admission in the institution till further orders.
- 11.4.4 To stop renewal of permission in respect of UG/PG Dental Courses.
- 11.4.6 To post the information regarding penalties so imposed on the concerned institution on the website of DCI for information of all concerned.

4. Besides above, it is also pertinent to mentioned here that, as per section 12.1 of subject regulations, each and every institution shall submit its reports in prescribed format (Annexure-II) to the Secretary, Dental Council of India, Aiwan-E-Galib Marg, Kotla Road, New Delhi-110002, by 31<sup>st</sup> October of every year in respect of the previous academic session, indicating the requisite information against each column thereof, failing which action mentioned in Regulation 11.4 would be initiated against defaulting institution.

5. All dental institutions should issue advertisements against ragging through signboards, pamphlets etc. before the commencement of academic year as well as during the midst of the session. You are also requested to issue booklets to all the students of your Institutions containing the details about what constitutes ragging, punishable ingredients of ragging, punishments and penalty for ragging, names and mobile numbers of the members of the Anti Ragging Squad, Anti Ragging Committee (Anti Ragging Helpline), Wardens, Deputy Wardens of Men's and Women's hostel.

All dental Institutions shall designate any of their faculty member(s) as "Counsellor" for fresher and senior students to co-ordinate the batches of students (Counselees) regularly about day-to-day problems and also to sensitize their role in curbing the menace of ragging.



7. You are further requested to obtain and file undertaking, on anti ragging, from all parents/guardians and students (1<sup>st</sup> year to final year) studying in BDS/MDS/PG Diploma/Para Dental Courses or any other course approved/recognised by DCI, online through [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in) / [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org).

8. In view of the above, I am directed to request you that the requisite information in the prescribed format (Annexure-II, already available with your institution) for the previous academic session 2016-2017 may kindly be sent to us by 31.10.2017, positively, as the said information is required to be sent to the Monitoring Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. In case the information is not received by 31.10.2017, the name of defaulting institution will be forwarded to the said Monitoring Committee for such appropriate action as may be deemed fit and proper by the said Hon'ble Monitoring Committee, and their names will also be uploaded on DCI Website.

9. This may kindly be treated as 'Most Urgent'.

10. The Dental Council of India ensures Zero Tolerance against ragging of any sort.

भारत के माननीय सर्वोच्च न्यायालय के दिशानिर्देशों के कार्यान्वयन एवं दंत कॉलेजों में रेगिंग की बुराई पर रोक लगाने के लिए सूचनाएं 31.10.2017 तक प्रस्तुत करने हेतु

मुझे यह कहने का निर्देश दिया गया है कि डीसीआई के नियमों के मुताबिक, दंत चिकित्सा महाविद्यालयों में यह सुनिश्चित करे कि उनके दंत संस्थान में रेगिंग की कोई घटना न हो और इसे रोकने के लिए किए गए उपाय की समीक्षा की जाए।

उपर्युक्त नियमों की धारा 11.3 के अनुसार, संस्थान के प्राधिकारी / प्रबंधन वर्ग (एस्ट. सोसाइटी आदि) प्रबंधन रूप से संस्थान का अध्यक्ष यह सुनिश्चित करने के लिए जिम्मेदार होगा कि संस्थान में रेगिंग की कोई घटना न हो। यदि रेगिंग की कोई घटना घटती है तो वह प्रबंधक वर्ग / अध्यक्ष ऐसे व्यक्ति / व्यक्तियों के विरुद्ध तत्काल और उपयुक्त कार्रवाई करेगा जिनके कर्तव्य की लापरवाही से यह घटना हुई। तदनुसार अध्यक्ष को नियुक्त किये जाने वाले पदनामित अधिकारी अध्यक्ष के विरुद्ध तत्काल और उपयुक्त कार्रवाई करेगा।

आपको यह भी सूचित किया जाता है कि यदि कोई संस्थान रेगिंग को रोकने में विफल रहता है तो इस पर दंत कालेजों में रेगिंग की बुराई पर रोक लगाने वाले डीसीआई विनियम, 2009 के खंड 11.4 के अनुसार शिर्षकित दंड के किसी एक या किसी भी संयोजन को लागू करेगा:

- 11.4.1 दंत चिकित्सा अधिनियम, 1948 के खंड 16ए के अधीन संस्थान के विरुद्ध मान्यता समाप्त करने की कार्रवाई शुरू करना।
- 11.4.2 संस्थान की दाखिला क्षमता में उतनी कमी करना जितना परिषद उचित समझे।
- 11.4.3 अगले आदेश होने तक संस्थान में और आगे दाखिले बंद करना।
- 11.4.4 यूजी/पीजी दंत पाठ्यक्रमों के संबंध में अनुमति का नवीकरण बंद करना।
- 11.4.5 संबंधित संस्थान पर इस तरह लगाए गए दंडों से संबंधित सूचना सभी संबंधितों की जानकारी के लिए डीसीआई के वेबसाइट पर प्रस्तुत करना।

उपर्युक्त के अलावा यह भी उल्लेखनीय है कि प्रत्येक दंत संस्थान में रेगिंग की बुराई पर रोक लगाने वाले डीसीआई विनियम के खंड 12.1 के अनुसार पिछले दशकिक स्तर के संबंध में अपेक्षित जानकारी (निर्धारित प्रारूप में) अपनी रिपोर्ट सचिव, भारतीय दंत परिषद, एवान-ए-ग्रातिव मार्ग, कोटला रोड, नई दिल्ली - 110002 तक प्रत्येक वर्ष 31 अक्टूबर, तक प्रस्तुत करें अन्यथा ऐसे दोषी संस्थानों के विरुद्ध विनियम की धारा 11.4 के अनुसार कार्रवाई की जा सकती है।

सभी दंत संस्थानों को अकादमिक वर्ष के आरंभ होने के साथ-साथ स्तर के दौरान भी साइजबोर्ड, व्यक्तिगत रूप से माध्यम से रेगिंग रोकने के लिए विज्ञापन देना चाहिए। आपको अनुरोध किया जाता है कि अपने संस्थान में रेगिंग को प्रतिबन्धित कर दें, जिससे विवरण हो कि रेगिंग क्या है, रेगिंग की दंडनीय गतिविधियां, रेगिंग के दंड व जुर्माना और रेगिंग विरोधी दस्तों के सदस्यों (एंडी रेगिंग कमेटी और एंडी रेगिंग हेल्पलाइन), पुस्तक 'रेगिंग होस्टल वाइजेंस / डिप्टी वाइजेंस आदि के नाम और मोबाइल नंबर।

6. सभी दंत संस्थान अपने किसी भी संकाय सदस्य (सदस्यो) को नये और वरिष्ठ छात्रों के लिए "सलाहकार" के रूप में नामित करे, जो दिन-प्रतिदिन की समस्याओं के बारे में नियमित रूप से विद्यार्थियों (काउन्सेलर) के दल को समन्वयित करने तथा रेगिंग कि बुराई को रोकने में उनकी भूमिका को संवेदित करने के लिए निर्दिष्ट करते रहे।

7. आपसे यह भी अनुरोध किया जाता है कि आप ऑनलाइन के माध्यम ([www.antiraqqing.in/](http://www.antiraqqing.in/) / [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org)) से बीडीएस / एमडीएस / पीजी डिप्लोमा / पैरा डेंटल पाठ्यक्रम या डीसीआई द्वारा मान्यता प्राप्त किसी भी अन्य पाठ्यक्रम में पढ़ाई करने वाले सभी छात्रों (प्रथम वर्ष से अंतिम वर्ष) और उनके माता-पिता / अभिभावकों से रेगिंग विरोधी होने का वचन पत्र प्राप्त करे।

8. उपरोक्त के मद्देनजर, मुझे आपसे अनुरोध करने के लिए निर्देश दिया गया है कि आप पिछले शैक्षणिक-सत्र 2016-2017 के लिए आवश्यक जानकारी, जो माननीय उच्चतम न्यायालय द्वारा नियुक्त मॉनिटरिंग कमेटी को भेजा जाना आवश्यक है, कृपया सकारात्मक रूप से, निर्धारित प्रारूप में (संलग्नक-II, जो आपकी संस्था के पास पहले से ही उपलब्ध है) 31.10.2017 तक हमें भेजी जाए। यदि सूचना 31.10.2017 तक प्राप्त नहीं हुई तो उस दोषी संस्थान का नाम उचित व उपयुक्त कार्यवाही के लिए मॉनिटरिंग कमेटी को भेजा जाएगा और उनके नाम भी डीसीआई वेबसाइट पर अपलोड कर दिये जाएंगे।
